I have called him plenty of times while he was judging in the boat and he always solved my problem.

North Carolina should be so proud to have had such a knowledgeable, fair and hardworking member of our skiing family as Gary Pressley. For me, tournaments will never be the same without him. Thank you Gary for being my friend.
